## **Instruction to Authors**

- 1. Manuscripts must be the original work of the author(s) and should not be a partial or complete duplicate of any other previously published work. Please note that the *Journal of Economic Research* uses a software to screen manuscripts for unoriginal material. Manuscripts must not be under review else where at time of submission to the *Journal of Economic Research*. Manuscripts for publication must be prepared in English.
- 2. With no exception, Abstract should be included. Normally, Abstract cannot exceed 150 words. Normally, the whole manuscript cannot exceed 30 printed pages.
- 3. You can use a format of your choice(i.e. MS Word, PDF(including original Tex file), Hancom Office format), but it is recommended to be MS WORD file.
- 4. References should be alphabetically ordered based on the last name of the first author and should assume the following format.
